
# **Annual Stewardship Appeal**


# The Fast of Cheesefare Week 🥽

As we continue to prepare for the Great Fast, Cheesefare Week is traditionally a week of fasting from meat. It is called "Cheesefare" because this is our last week to eat dairy until Pascha, so we would traditionally eat or drink all our dairy (and eggs) this week. Cheesefare Sunday (Feb. 23<sup>rd</sup>) ends Cheesefare Week and the forty-days of the Great Fast begin with Clean Monday (February 24<sup>th</sup>).

"Today this fast is considered a part of the Great Fast, a preparation period in which we enter gradually into the asceticism of the Fast. It originated, however, in the Oriental Orthodox (non- Chalcedonian) Churches and was separate from the Great Fast. It was called the Fast of Nineveh, and was observed three weeks before the Great Fast, in what is now the Week after the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee. The Byzantine Church would not observe it at the same time as those Churches with which it was not in communion and moved it to the week before the Great Fast." – Fr. David Petras

## Support Mary's Mantle during the Great Fast





## Adult ECF begins during the Great Fast

This year, we will meet after Divine Liturgy on the Sundays of the Great Fast in the small hall to share simple Lenten food and the participate in this formation focused on repentance, led by Kevin Perotta:

"Repentance is a gift—because coming to the realization of ourselves as sinners opens our hearts to the gospel. And while consciousness of our sins is uncomfortable, it is also a cause for hope. In those feelings of guilt, says popular Scripture commentator Kevin Perrotta, God is calling us to return to him.

"The first three sessions of this Bible study are designed to spur readers to reflect on their own experience of recognizing their sins and taking action against them. The second three sessions focus on Jesus, who calls us to grow in love beyond



anything that is easy or comfortable for us—and enables us to do it by nourishing us with himself."
