

THE FIRST HOUR

If this Hour is not appended to Matins, we begin with the blessing and Trisagion Prayers as follows. If this Hour is appended to Matins, we begin with the Call to Worship ("Come let us worship..." on page 4).

The priest, vested in epitrachilion, and deacon, fully vested, come before the Royal Doors.



Troparion

If the Typikon appoints more than one Troparia, all but the final Troparion are sung before the "Glory..."

Cantor: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit

The Troparion of the day, saint, or feast is sung as appointed by the Typikon.

Theotokion of the Hour

In the same tone as the Troparion:

Cantor: Now and ever and forever. Amen.

A Paradise; for you have brought forth the Flower of Immortality?

A Virgin; for you have remained undefiled?

A Mother, holding in her holy arms the Son who is the God of all?



Kontakion


The kontakion of the day, saint, or feast is sung as appointed by the Typikon.

The priest and deacon, leaving the altar by the northern door, come in front of the Royal Doors.


"Lord, have mercy" is now sung forty times. It may be sung in several languages:

Prayer of the Hours

Priest: or Leader:

O Christ our God, in all times and places you are worshiped and glorified both in heaven and on earth. You are long-suffering and generous in your mercy and compassion. You love the just and show mercy to the sinner, calling all to salvation through the promise of blessings to come. At this very hour, O Lord, receive our supplications and direct our lives in the path of your commandments. Sanctify our souls; purify our bodies; set right our minds; cleanse our thoughts; deliver us from all affliction, trouble and distress; surround us with your holy angels so that, guided and guarded in their camp, we may attain oneness of faith and the knowledge of your unspeakable glory. For you are blessed forever and ever.

If a priest is not present, the Leader concludes with this "Amen," and the people do not respond "Amen" to this prayer.

If a priest is not present, this prayer of the priest is omitted, and First Hour continues with the Dismissal ("Glory..." on p. 15).

If the Third Hour is to follow immediately, begin the Hour with the Call to Worship ("Come, let us worship..."). Otherwise, the following Dismissal.
