If you are prudently unable to go to confession at this time, confess and express your sorrow for your sins to the Lord and prayerfully resolve to go to confession as soon as it becomes prudent. We are forgiven the moment we repent, which includes the intention to confess.

Holy Anointing

The public liturgical service of Holy Anointing, which we would have celebrated on the evening of Holy Wednesday, is postponed until after this pandemic has ended. Bishop Milan wants us all to remember also that this holy anointing must be preceded by a recent confession.

Public Liturgical Services

All public liturgical services and all other events and gatherings are cancelled in the Eparchy of Parma at least through and including May 17th. However, we continue to pray for you daily and to celebrate liturgy privately for your intentions. Please continue to pray and to pray for us.

St. Stephen's goal this year: \$9,200

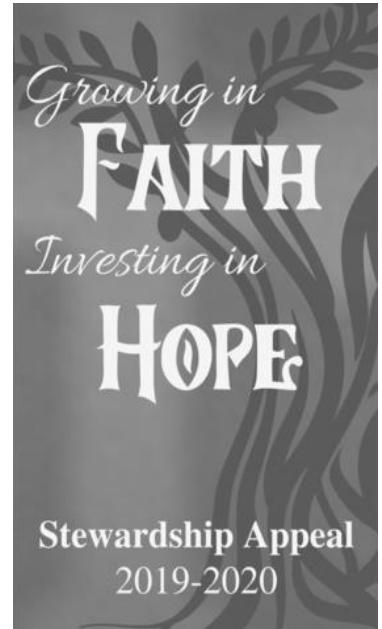
As of the end of April, 34 contributors have donated \$5719.25 and pledged \$5,769.25.
