
# VESPERS PROPERS FOR JUNE 4<sup>TH</sup>, 2020 from the Menaion

# <sup>1</sup>Pentecost Thursday

**Our holy father Metrophanes, patriarch of Constantinople,** who consecrated the New Rome to the Lord. He had borne witness to the faith in the persecution of the emperor Diocletian. (325)

The holy myrrh-bearers, Martha and Mary, who received the Lord Jesus into their home in Bethany near Jerusalem and were His friends. When their brother Lazarus had died, Martha confessed, "You are Christ, the Son of God who has come into the world."



# Aposticha

The aposticha are from the Pentecostarion: (Tone 4)

# **Aposticheron:**

**O** Holy Spirit, with the Father and the Word, \* You are equal in power, majesty, and dominion. \* Co-creating, ever-existing, all-good, and ruling all things, \* You have filled

the disciples of the Word with wisdom. \* In a multitude of languages \* they proclaim God's mighty works to the nations, \*\* together with the teachings of the Trinity.


**Cantor**: A pure heart create for me, O God; put a steadfast spirit within me.

## **Aposticheron:**

The assembly of nations was made fruitful in the Spirit, \* but the unbelievers were darkened by the drunkenness of ignorance. \* When they witnessed the miracle of tongues, \* they said that your disciples were drunk. \* They were deceived by a worse drunkenness, \* while we, who have received the saving knowledge of You through your elect, \*\* proclaim your wonders, O our God.

**Cantor:** Do not cast me away from your presence, nor deprive me of your Holy Spirit. **Aposticheron:** 


