
GREAT VESPERS PROPERS FOR JULY 15TH

from the Menaion

The holy great prince Vladimir, equal to the apostles, who was baptized Basil at Kiev in Rus'. Son of Prince Svyatoslav, grandson of Igor and Olga, he was pagan for the fist part of his life. He sent out envoys to find the religion best suited for his people, and he and his court were baptized in the orthodox faith. He bestowed care in spreading the orthodox faith among the peoples subject to him. (1015)







Cantor: I have exalted one chosen from my people.


Aposticheron:
