



Cantor: Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my pleading. (on 7)

Cantor: Praise the Lord, all you nations, acclaim him all you peoples! **Psalm 116** (on 2)






Cantor: Strong is the love of the Lord for us; he is faithful forever.

Cantor: (*Tone 6*) Glory...now and ever...



Verse: Why was it, sea, that you fled, that you turned back, Jordan, on your course?


