Troparion

During the troparion after the Lord is God, the shroud is incensed on the diakonikon 3 times. The priest carries the shroud lead by incense and candles out the North door, followed by the people around the church (outside if possible) 1 or 3 times ending before the grave.



Repeat Troparion after each verse:


Before the Polyeleos begins, the priest vests in the phelonion. The deacon opens the holy doors and, while the Polyeleos is sung, the priest incenses the Holy Table, the icon screen, the church, and the people, preceded by the deacon carrying a lighted candle.






During the singing of the Festal Exaltation, the icon of the feast (if one be had) is solemnly carried in procession from the Holy Table, through the Holy Doors, and enthroned on the Tetrapod, where it is censed on the Tetrapod by the priest during the singing of the Exaltation.




The Canon is now sung. The clergy and faithful venerate the Gospel Book. The priest (taking the hand cross) and deacon (taking the blessed oil) go to the tetrapod, where the priest anoints all those who come forward to venerate the Gospel Book. After the anointing is completed, they return to the altar. The Holy Doors are closed, and the priest removes the phelonion.

Canon of the Dormition



The heavenly choirs encircled your holy body in Zion while the choir of apostles, assembling from the ends of the earth, stood beside you, O Theotokos. Along with them, we also honor your holy memory, O most pure Virgin.




Kontakion - Tone 2:

You always fulfill the petitions of those who come to you in faith. Therefore, grant me the words, the tongue, and the thoughts that are without shame; for every gift that enlightens us comes from You, the Enlightener of our souls, and the Lord who dwelt in a virginal womb.



The choir of apostles attended the divine Ark of holiness in Zion while singing: O Tabernacle of the living God, where are you going? Continue to guard those who sing to you in faith: Because we have been saved, we glorified the one and only Creator and praise Him above all forever.




As the pure Virgin left the earth, she raised up her hands in which she had embraced the incarnate God, and she confidently spoke to her Son, saying: Remember forever those whom You have given me and who sing out to You: Because we have been saved, we glorify the one and only Creator and praise Him above all forever.

At the end of Ode 8, the deacon (or priest, if there is no deacon) comes with the censer before the icon of the Theotokos on the icon screen. Incensing her icon, he intones:

Deacon: Let us greatly extol the Theotokos and the Mother of Light in hymns!


Then he incenses the whole Church as usual, beginning with the Holy Table, while the faithful sing.





The magnification is repeated.

The heavenly choirs were astonished as they beheld their master in Zion holding the soul of a woman in his hands. As a Son, it was fitting that He spoke to her who had given birth to Him without stain and said: Come and share the glory of your Son and your God.



The assembly of apostles gathered around your body, which had contained God. Beholding it with awe, they cried out with a clear voice: Save your people as you pass over to the heavenly mansions of your Son.

After the Ninth Ode, the deacon (or priest if no deacon is present) stands before the Holy Doors and says the Little Litany from the ambon.
