
TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

The holy Philemon and his companions of Colossae, for whose love in Christ Jesus blessed Paul the Apostle rejoiced and who is venerated together with his wife St. Apphia.


The holy martyrs Cecilia, Valerian, Tiburtius and Maximus. St. Cecilia, virgin and martyr, who it is said attained that double palm for the love of Christ at Rome in the cemetery of Callistus on the Appian Way and whose name provides the ancient title of a church, Trastevere [across the Tiber]. She was martyred after she buried with loving care the bodies of the martyrs Valerian, Tiburtius, and Maximus. (c.230)
