

Something very special is coming for members of St. Stephen Byzantine Catholic Church on Meat Fare Sunday. As you know, we Eastern Catholics begin our preparation for Pascha in some very special ways. This year is really special.

Meat Fare Sunday (**February 7, 2021**) is traditionally the last day we eat meat until Pascha. This year, we will have a potluck on Meat Fare Sunday. (Fr. John says, "luck is a heresy" – where he's from they call this a "pitch-in"). Sign up with what you plan to bring on the sign-up sheet in the vestibule fo the church. (Hopefully we get plenty of meat dishes – but also a good variety). We'll begin our meal around noon.

But then we'll get to the real "meat" of the event: at around 1pm, we will do a Spiritual Gift Discernment exercise. Dan Lauffer, our Director of Evangelization, will present about spiritual gifts and then we will do a personal gift discernment which will help you discern what the Holy Spirit has gifted you with and will help the Church to understand better what gifts our members have for the upbuilding of the Church.

In preparation, read Romans 12; 1 Corinthians 12; and Ephesians 4.
