



5. II. WE BELIEVE IN THE TRINITY, ONE IN ESSENCE AND UNDIVIDED C. We Believe in the Holy Spirit

And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

(Symbol of Faith)

Through him the Holy Spirit was made manifest, the Spirit of truth, the grace of sonship, the pledge of the inheritance to come, the first fruit of the eternal good things, the life-giving power, the source of sanctification.


(Anaphora of the Liturgy of Saint Basil the Great)

- The Holy Spirit is the Third Divine Person and proceeds from the Father (see *Jn* 15:26). This procession [i.e., coming forth] of the Holy Spirit can be explained through an image, making use of an analogy: the Father is the source, the Son is the stream, the Holy Spirit is the water. There is only one source for the stream and the water, only one Father for the Son and for the Holy Spirit, which like water flows from the source and fills the river-bed and stream.⁷¹ The Holy Spirit is a Divine Person that is equally worshipped and glorified with the Father and the Son, proceeding from the Father, coming to rest in the Word, and expressing the Word.⁷²
- The Holy Spirit is often compared to *breath*, by which the spoken word resounds. Appropriately, within the Most Holy Trinity, the Father speaks the Word (begets the Son) by the Holy Spirit: "And it is this [Breath] which in the moment of utterance becomes the articulate word, revealing in itself the force of the word."⁷³
