

A group of us have formed a lecture series on religious freedom which we hope will help inspire the whole world at least our own part of it with the courage to receive Christ as their Lord and Master.


The inaugural lecture in that series will be presented by Dame Juliana Taimoorazy who with much of her family fled Iran in 1989 and has founded the Iraqi Christian Relief Council. Through the council's efforts thousands of suffering Christians in Iraq (Assyria) have been saved and given assistance. Moreover, Juliana has testified before the US Congress and has visited many countries with families who have needed their help. In 2021 she was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. CHRIST – OUR PASCHA Part One THE FAITH OF THE CHURCH

III. WE BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH, AND IN OUR SAVIOUR JESUS CHRIST, AND IN THE HOLY SPIRIT, THE LORD, THE GIVER OF LIFE

Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. (Symbol of Faith)

Lord of heaven and earth and of all creation visible and invisible. (Anaphora of the Liturgy of Saint Basil the Great)

A. The Creator and His Creation

- Our faith in the Creator gives us the opportunity to grasp the sense and essence of the created world. Biblical Revelation unveils for us the presence of God within the reality of the world: we come to know the Creator, and the world—his creation.
- The word *creation* points to the connection between the world and the Person of the Creator; for the world is "the work of his hands." This is why it is impossible to know creation separately from the Creator. God's Revelation brings to our attention not so much the laws of nature as the actions of the Creator's Divine Economy. In the light of faith, the true beauty of creation is revealed to us as a reflection of the beauty and magnificence of its Creator: "Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all" (*Ps* 103[104]:24).
