



# HOLY BISHOP MARTYR THEODORE ROMZHA RELIGIOUS FREEDOM LECTURES

Join us for the first annual "Holy Bishop Martyr Theodore Romzha Religious Freedom Lecture." Bishop Theodore's courage stands In a long line of Christians who have freely given their lives for the love of Christ and the world that starts with the first martyr of the Christian Church, St. Stephen.

The Religious Freedom Lecture has been postponed due to circumstances beyond our control. The new date is **September 25, 2022** and will continue to be held in the Crystal Room at St. Stephen Byzantine Catholic Church..

The inaugural lecture in that series will be presented by Dame Juliana Taimoorazy who with much of her family fled Iran in 1989 and has founded the Iraqi Christian Relief Council. Through the council's efforts thousands of suffering Christians in Iraq (Assyria) have been saved and given assistance. Moreover, Juliana has testified before the US Congress and has visited many countries with families who have needed their help. In 2021 she was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. #### The Triodion

We begin using the Triodion this Sunday (the Sunday of the Publican & the Pharisee)

22 days before Clean Monday (the first day of the Great Fast, beginning with Forgiveness Vespers).

The Great Fast is 40 days (from Clean Monday through the Friday before Lazarus Saturday).

We continue using the Triodion for another 8 days (Lazarus Sat., Palm Sunday, & all of Holy Week).

The last service in the Triodion is the Midnight Office of Pascha.

Thus the Triodion covers 70 days (from the Sun. of the Publican & the Pharisee through Holy Sat.). Speaking in terms of weeks, it is 3 weeks of preparation for the Great Fast, 6 weeks of the Great Fast, and Holy Week, for a total of 10 weeks.

In the Byzantine tradition, the Great Fast is 40 days, \*counting Sundays,\* from Clean Monday through the Friday before Lazarus Saturday. Lazarus Saturday, Palm Sunday, & Holy Week are not part of the 40 days. At Vespers for Lazarus Saturday, the first stichera begins, "Having come to the end of the forty days...."

# CHRIST – OUR PASCHA Part One THE FAITH OF THE CHURCH

III. WE BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH, AND IN OUR SAVIOUR JESUS CHRIST, AND IN THE HOLY SPIRIT, THE LORD, THE GIVER OF LIFE

#### A. The Creator and His Creation

- 1. The Father Creates through the Son in the Holy Spirit
- In loving humankind, God moved forth from the unapproachable light of his inner divine life and revealed himself in the world created by him: "Today the Sun that never sets has risen and the world is filled with splendour by the light of the Lord." The foundation of the world is "the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God our Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit" (see 2 *Cor* 13:13). On the participation of the three Persons of the Most Holy Trinity in the creation of the world, Saint Basil teaches: "When you consider creation, I advise you to first think of him who is the first cause of everything that exists: namely, the Father, and then of the Son, who is creator, and then of the Holy Spirit, the perfector." Created in love, this world becomes a *temple*, the place and environment of God's relationship with humanity. The presence of God in the world, as if in a temple, is a prefigurement of the entry of the Son of God into human flesh, the incarnation (see *Heb* 10:5).
- The Incarnation of the Son of God reveals the purpose of the created world. At the appointed moment of history, the Son of God descends into creation in order to raise creation to God. This is accomplished by the action of the Holy Spirit. In the six days of creation, the Holy Spirit prepares an environment for humanity (see *Gn* 1). In the Old Testament, God prepares humanity for the encounter with the incarnate Son of God, so that through Jesus Christ all creation might be brought to the Father, and "that God may be all in all" (1 *Cor* 15:28).
