

Come, Follow Me


A program of parish renewal and scripture study for discipleship with weekly exercises and homework. Next meeting: **Monday**, **August 22**nd, **2022**.



Their facility provides vital resources at no cost to current and expecting mothers, from pregnancy testing to professional counseling, in Detroit's most underserved area.

We can currently assist them by providing the following donations: **diapers** (sizes 4-6), **Pull-Ups** (2T-3T, 4T-5T), **baby wipes, baby lotion, baby shampoo, baby powder** (no talc), **pacifiers/teethers, and diaper bags**.
