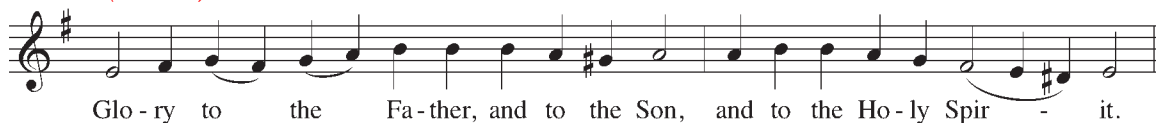
TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Our venerable father Alypius the Stylite at Hadrianopolis in Paphlagonia, deacon, who died near the age of one hundred. (640)

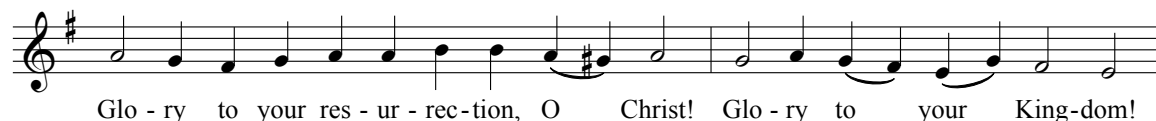
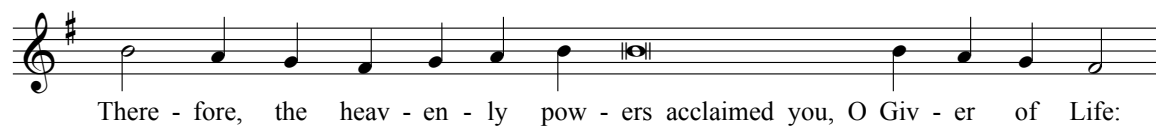


The stone was sealed by the Jews, soldiers guard - ed your most pure

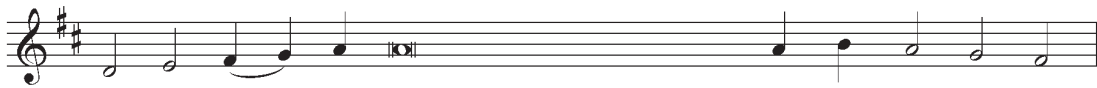

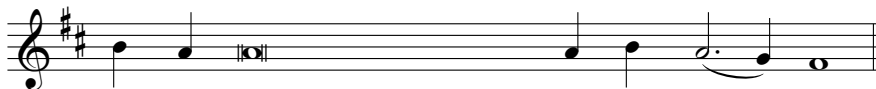
