
Matins Propers for the Sunday after Christmas

The reader chants only **Psalm 87** on page 4 followed by "Glory..." on page 6. Matins continues with the Litany of Peace on page 7.








Troparion of the Sunday after the Nativity - *Tone 2*

People: Lord, have mercy (*three times*)

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit

Reader: Now and ever and forever. Amen.

The 2nd stasis of the 3rd Kathisma: **Psalm 18**

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament proclaims his handiwork. Day unto day pours out the word and night unto night imparts knowledge. No speech, no word, no voice is heard yet through all the earth their voice resounds; their message reaches to the ends of the world. There he has placed a tent for the sun; it comes forth like a bridegroom coming from his tent, rejoices like a champion to run its course. At the end of the sky is the rising of the sun; to the furthest end of the sky is its course. There is nothing concealed from its burning heat. The law of the Lord is perfect, it revives the soul. The rule of the Lord is to be trusted; it gives wisdom to the simple. The precepts of the Lord are right, they gladden the heart. The command of the Lord is clear, it gives light to the eyes. The fear of the Lord is holy, abiding forever. The decrees of the Lord are truth and all of them just. They are more to be desired than gold, than the purest of gold and sweeter are they than honey, than honey from the comb. So in them your servant finds instruction; great reward is in their keeping. But who can detect all his errors? From hidden faults acquit me. From presumption restrain your servant and let it not rule me. Then shall I be blameless, clean from grave sin. May the spoken words of my mouth, the thoughts of my heart, win favor in your sight, O Lord, my rescuer, my rock!

Psalm 19

May the Lord hear you on the day of distress; may the name of Jacob's God protect you. May he send you help from his shrine and give you support from Zion. May he remember all your offerings and receive your sacrifice with favor. May he give you your

heart's desire and fulfill every one of your plans. May we ring out our joy at your victory and rejoice in the name of our God. (May the Lord grant all your prayers.) I am sure now that the Lord will give victory to his anointed, will reply from his holy heaven with the mighty victory of his hand. Some trust in chariots or horses, but we in the name of the Lord. They will collapse and fall, but we shall hold and stand firm. O Lord, save the king, and hear us when we call upon you.

Psalm 20

Lord, your strength gladdens the king; he rejoices greatly in your salvation. You have granted him his heart's desire; you have not refused the prayer of his lips. You came to meet him with the blessings of success, you have set on his head a crown of precious stones. He asked you for life and this you have given, days that will last from age to age. Your saving help has given him glory. You have laid upon him majesty and splendor; you have granted your blessings to him forever. You have made him rejoice with the joy of your presence. The king has put his trust in the Lord: through the mercy of the Most High he shall stand firm. His hand will seek and find all his foes, his right hand finds out those that hate him. You will burn them like a blazing furnace on the day when you appear. And the Lord will destroy them in his anger; fire will swallow them up. You will wipe out their race from the earth and their children from the sons of men. Though they plan evil against you, though they plot, they shall not prevail. For you will force them to retreat; at them you will aim with your bow. Be exalted, O Lord, in your strength; we will sing and praise your mighty deeds.

Alleluia, alleluia! Glory to you, O God! (three times)



The first two Antiphons of the Stepenna (Gradual Hymns) are omitted. The Third Antiphon of the Stepenna in Tone 7:






Matins continues with the Prokeimenon ("Let us be attentive...") on page 22.

Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!


Glory to You! Glory to You, O God incarnate, whose good pleasure it was to take flesh of the pure Virgin! Joseph cried aloud.

Glory to You! Glory to You, O Jesus, Son of God, who was born of the Virgin and has rendered the memory of David and James illustrious!


Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!

Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!




Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!


David the king is shown to be a wondrous prophet and forefather of the incarnation of God; and James, the disciple of Jesus, is shown forth as the first bishop.




Theotokion: We beseech you, O Virgin Theotokos: On behalf of your servants entreat Him who was incarnate of you, for we know you to be our sole intercessor.

Kontakion & Ikos (page 34)



Ikos: The Incorporeal One is, through the ineffable Counsel, born in the flesh; He that is uncontainable is now contained in a body and preserves both essences immutably; He that is without beginning and Who alone is beyond time takes on a beginning; an Infant of surpassing perfection is beheld; He that bears all things is born in arms. Wherefore, as God, He crowns through His birth those who are honored by their kinship with Him, and, glorifying them with faith, we cry out unceasingly: O Compassionate One, save them that honor you!

The Synaxarion is omitted & the Canon continues with Ode 7.

Ode 7

Irmos: Once, in Babylon, the children of Abraham trampled upon the flame of the furnace, crying aloud in hymns: O God of our fathers, blessed are you!

Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!


Amazed beyond words by the birthgiving of Mary, the Theotokos, the angelic choirs cried out to Joseph: Glory in the highest, and on earth peace!

Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!

David, the leader of the bride, and James, who was the chamberlain of the divine Church, say: O God, incarnate for our sake, blessed are You!


Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!

O king among prophets and a prophet among kings, chant with the divinely wise James and lift your voice in song for us: O Christ, who was incarnate for our sake, blessed are you!



Theotokion: Prefigured in the unconsumed bush and in the bedewed furnace, O Mother most pure, you bore without seed God incarnate, O ever blessed one.

Ode 8 is omitted, the people **stand** & Matins continues with "Let us greatly extol..." & the Canticle of the Theotokos on p. 34.

Ode 9

Irmos: On the mountain Moses beheld the unconsumed bush; and in the cave Joseph heard the ineffable birth. O Theotokos, Virgin undefiled, Mother who knew not man, we magnify you!

Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!


With trembling, all creation ministers to Him that has been born of the Virgin: the heavens with a star; the earth with a manger; the mountain with a cave; the magi with gifts; the shepherds with wonder; and the angels with the hymn, Glory to God in the highest!

Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!

Of old David was chosen king from among the shepherds; and you, O James, are from the royal tribe of Judah. You are shown to be a shepherd of the flock of the Incarnate One, the Lamb, the Son of God Most High.

Refrain: Holy Relatives of God, pray to God for us!



Matins continues with the Small Litany on page 36.




Hymn of Light (page 37)

The two sons of Zebedee, with Peter, Nathanael, and Thomas, and two others were fishing in the Lake of Tiberias. By the command of Christ, they cast the net on the right side and drew out many fish. Peter, recognizing Christ, came swimming toward him. This was the third appearance of the Lord after his Resurrection. Then he shared with them bread and fish from the fire.





Stichera (page 40)

The Lord has sworn and he will not repent.






Cantor (*Tone 6*) in place of "I will praise you, Lord...":
