

This Sunday's Hymns and Proper's - Tone 7

The propers (changeable parts) of the Divine Liturgy for Sunday, November 23, are Resurrectional Tone 7, pages 156-158 in the teal pew book, and the feast of Entrance of the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary into the Temple, pages 268-271. Prescribed is that the Resurrectional entry is sung first, followed by the corresponding Feast Day entry. Thus for today we sing:

Troparion of teh Resurrection, Tone 7 - bottom of Page 156

Troparion of Entrance of Theotokos, Tone 4 - top of Page 268

Glory...Now and Ever..., Tone 4 - middle of Page 141 (or follow the cantor)

Kontakion of Entrance of Theotokos, Tone 4 - middle of Page 268

Prokeimenon, Tone 7 with verse - Page 158, then Tone 3 without verse - top of Page 269

Alleluia, Tone 7 with verses - Page 158, then Tone 8 with verses - Page 269

Instead of "It is truly proper...": Magnification and Irmos - Pages 269 - 270

Communion Hymns - for Sunday (Psalm 148:1) Page 78, then for Feast (Psalm 115:4) Page 271

Also for this Sunday, which is in the Phillip's Fast period before Christmas, instead of the three Sunday Antiphons we will sing the first and second Typical Psalm, simple form, on pages 16 and 17, and the Beatitudes on page 23.
