

The Blessing of Homes

In the **Byzantine Catholic tradition**, the blessing of homes takes place **after the Feast of Theophany (Epiphany)**, usually during the month of **January**. During this visit, a priest comes to the home to sprinkle it with **Holy Water blessed in church**, asking God to pour out His blessing, protection, and grace upon the household. Through this beautiful tradition, the home is renewed as a “**temple of the Holy Spirit**,” a place where faith is lived, prayer is offered, and Christ dwells among His people.

Purpose of the Blessing

† Sanctification

To ask God to bless the home and all who live there, making it a holy space filled with peace and grace.

† Spiritual Renewal

A yearly renewal of our baptismal calling, reminding us to live our faith daily within our families.

† Pastoral Connection

An opportunity for the priest and family to connect, sharing joys, struggles, and prayer together.

Preparation for the Blessing

Prepare a small table with:

- Icons of Christ, the Theotokos, and Saints. A cross and prayer books. A lit candle
- Environment**
- Turn off televisions and radios. Clear a path through the home. Turn on lights in all rooms
