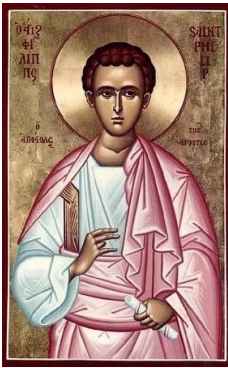

32nd Sunday After Pentecost - Sunday of Zacchaeus - Tone 7

The minimum propers (required changeable parts) for Tone 7 are on Pages 156-158 of the teal pew book. Per the approved TYPICON, a prescribed Marian Kontakion can be added, called a Theotokion. Each tone has an approved Theotokion. Tradition is to add it when the content of the propers is not complex, such as during many Sundays after Pentecost. The Theotokion for tones 5-7 is "Steadfast Protectress," Tone 6 (Page 426). Thus, for today we sing:

Glory..., Tone 7 - Top of Page 158 (or follow cantor, exclude Now and Ever)

Kontakion of Resurrection, Tone 7 - Bottom of Page 157

Now and Ever..., Tone 6 - Near top of Page 153 (or follow cantor)

Theotokion, Tone 6 - Top of Page 426

Prokeimenon, Tone 7- Middle of Page 158; **Alleluia**, Tone 7 - Bottom of Page 158
