GREAT LENTEN PRAYER CHAIN

During this holy season of the Great Fast, we invite all parishioners to commit to daily prayer and to offer these prayers for **peace in the world, for our Church, for our families, and for the sick and suffering**. Please pray the following each day during Great Lent:

O Theotokos and Virgin, rejoice, O Mary, full of grace; the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the Fruit of thy womb, for thou hast borne the Savior of our souls. (*Prostration*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

O Baptist of Christ, be mindful of us all, that we may be delivered from our iniquities, for unto thee is given the grace to pray on behalf of us all. (*Prostration*)
Now and ever, and forever, Amen.

Pray for us, holy apostles and all the saints, that we may be delivered from perils and afflictions: for our fervent supplicants before the Savior. (*Prostration*)

We take refuge beneath thy tender mercy, O Theotokos: despise not our supplications in distress, but deliver us from perils, for thou alone art pure and blessed. (*No prostration*)

Lord, have mercy. (**40 times**). Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and forever Amen. More honorable than the Cherubim, and beyond compare more glorious than the Seraphim, who without corruption gavest birth to God the Word, the very Theotokos, thee do we magnify.

- honey
- ground walnuts
- raisins, mixed dried fruit, **dried apricots**
- powdered sugar/ shredded coconut (for decoration)

Koliva – First Friday of the Great Fast

Koliva (also called **kollyva**) is a traditional liturgical food made from boiled wheat, prepared and blessed in the Eastern Christian tradition. It is especially associated with the **First Friday of the Great Fast**, when the Church remembers God's providence and proclaims the hope of the Resurrection.

History of Koliva

The tradition of koliva is connected with **Saint Theodore the Recruit (St. Theodore Tiron)**. In the 4th century, during the first week of the Great Fast, Emperor Julian the Apostate attempted to defile the fasting of Christians by ordering food in the markets to be sprinkled with meat sacrificed to idols. Saint Theodore appeared in a dream to the bishop of Constantinople and warned him not to allow the faithful to buy food from the markets. Instead, he instructed them to prepare and eat **boiled wheat (koliva)**. Through this divine intervention, the faithful were protected, and the Church has remembered this miracle ever since by blessing koliva on the First Friday of the Great Fast.

Spiritual Meaning

Koliva recalls the words of Christ:

"Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." (John 12:24) For this reason, koliva symbolizes **death and resurrection**, as well as the Christian hope of **eternal life**.
